OH NO!! You didn't carry the canyon on hole #12, North course! According to Rule 17.1, you have three choices:

 Drop the ball two club lengths from the edge of the canyon where the ball crossed.
Play Back-on-the-Line relief, meaning you can drop the ball as far back in line keeping you, the point of entry and the pin, in line.
Stroke-and-distance, meaning you can re-tee the ball.

If your tee shot DOES carry the canyon but rolls back into canyon, then you can drop a ball two club lengths laterally (either side), no nearer to the hole from where the ball rolled in.

All of the above options are for one stroke penalty.
