### **RULES CORNER**



Much to your chagrin, an almost perfect approach shot rolled just off the green. A tight lie makes putting a good option for your next shot EXCEPT for the presence of a poorly placed sprinkler head!

What is the ruling?

If the sprinkler head is within 2 club lengths of the green, and the ball is within 2 club lengths of the sprinkler head AND the sprinkler head is on the line of play, you can take relief by dropping within 1 club length of nearest point of relief, no closer to hole. After taking relief, you may choose to chip or putt. This is a local Torrey Pines golf course rule.

If the sprinkler head interferes with your stance, you may take relief per Rule 16-1. Drop within 1 club length from the nearest point of relief, no closer to the hole.
