Rules Corner



How to take relief from a cart path: A cart path is an immovable obstruction. You can hit the ball where it lies on the cart path or you can take free relief.

It is important to determine which side of the cart path is the nearest point of complete relief.

To determine the nearest point of relief, find the nearest point where you can take a stance with the club you intend to use, making sure your stance is completely off the path. When you take your stance, the point of relief is where the club head is. Place a tee there. Then, take your longest club and measure away from the position you first marked with a tee, no closer to the hole and place a 2nd tee there. The relief area is pie-shaped, created by the 2 tees. Note, you don't have to place tees and measure with your driver – this is recommended to ensure you drop correctly. If the ball lies exactly in the middle of the cart path, then for a righthanded player, the nearest point of relief would be the left side of the

Your nearest point of relief cannot be in a Penalty Area. It must be in the same area of the golf course where you are taking relief (general area or bunker).

cart path.
