Rules Corner



Question: Your ball is in the general area (fairway or rough) and you accidentally hit your ball and the ball moves a bit. What should you do?

Answer: You must replace the ball to its original spot and incur a one stroke penalty. Rule 9.4b. If you do not replace the ball and hit it from where it is, then you will incur general penalty (2 strokes) for hitting the ball from the wrong spot. Rule 14.7a.

Question: What if your ball is on the green and you accidentally hit it?

Answer: You must replace the ball in the original spot without incurring penalty. Rule 13.1d.

Question: What if your ball is on the green and someone else's ball hits your ball?

Answer: If someone else's ball came from off of the green, such as a chip shot, then there is no penalty. But if someone else's ball was on the green, then the person making the stroke incurs a two stroke penalty (in stroke play only). Rule 11.1a.
