Rules Corner



Question: Can you test the green you are putting on by rubbing the surface or rolling a ball on it?

Answer: No, you are not allowed to test the green by rubbing the surface with your hand or rolling a ball. You will incur a general penalty - two strokes. Rule 13.1e

Question: I don't think I can play my ball as it lies in the bunker – what are my options?

Answer: If you don't want to or decide you can't play your ball as it lies in a bunker, you may decide it's unplayable. If so, you have four options. You have three one penalty stroke relief options:

(1) You may play a ball from the spot of your previous stroke (if this

- spot of your previous stroke (if this spot was out of the bunker, this option gets you out of the bunker but if your last stroke was from IN the bunker, you must stay in the bunker). Rule **19.2a**
- (2) You may take back-on-the-line relief IN the bunker. Rule **19.2b.**
- at Torrey North:

 (3) You may drop in the bunker within two club-lengths of where your ball lies but not nearer to the hole. Rule 19.2c

Your fourth relief option comes with two penalty strokes – you may get out of the bunker using the backon-the-line relief option. **Rule 19.3b**
