If your ball lands in the rough, you can search for it for no more than one minute, then drop another ball in the area you estimate it to be lost and continue to play without penalty.

Rules Corner



Question: Mary had a one foot tap-in putt. She putted from the other side of the hole to avoid stepping on anyone's line. Well, she missed the putt, and the ball went past the hole. However, it hit Mary's foot and ricocheted into the hole. Is there a penalty?

Answer: No, there is no penalty and the ball is considered holed.

Rule 11.1a: If a player's ball in motion accidentally hits the player or the person attending the flagstick:

- *There is no penalty to the player.
- *The ball is played where it lies.

Exception: Ball played on putting green in Stroke play: If the player's ball in motion hits another ball at rest on the putting green and both balls were on the putting green before the stroke, the player gets the general penalty – two penalty strokes. There is no penalty in Match Play.
