# **Rules Corner**



Question: Michelle thought she could drive the green on a short par 4 (of course she did!), so she swung hard and picked her head up, anxious to see where the ball went (sounds about right!). Her ball ended up lodging itself in a palm tree(of course it did!). She can see the ball and identify that it's hers but it's not playable unless she can climb the tree. What are her options?

Answer: If she decides not to climb the tree (that's questionable), she has 3 relief options, all for a 1 stroke penalty. 1) Go back to the spot of previous stroke. Since it was her tee shot, she can re-tee. 2) Go back as far as she likes and drop on the line from the hole through the spot where the ball lines (back-on-the-line relief). 3) Drop the ball anywhere within 2

3) Drop the ball anywhere within 2 lengths of where her ball would lie on the ground below its spot in the tree, no closer to the hole. Rule 19.2.

If your ball lies in a bunker, you must remain in the bunker under options 2 and 3. A 4<sup>th</sup> option for an extra penalty stroke (two total) allows you to go back on the line and drop outside the bunker. Rule 19.3.
