green versus laying up. TIN CUP!

Question: What is your favorite rule when you get in a pickle? Answer: It should be "stroke-and distance", Rule 18.1. It means you can redo your shot with a onestroke penalty. Most of us are aware of this rule for Out-of-Bounds or Lost Ball but this rule can be used to save you 1 or more strokes. Here are some of the situations you can take advantage of this rule:

\* "Fried egg" lies in a bunker.

\* When your ball is up against a tree and the options of lateral relief and back-on-the-line relief don't leave you with nice angles into the hole.

\* When your ball is in a bush and it would be tough to use other unplayable lie options.

\* When you're just off the green and you accidentally hit your chip shot thin and it rolls into the water.

AND, the best part is you don't even have to retrieve your ball first! Just tell another player you are playing under stroke-and-distance and grab a fresh ball from your bag. *Courtesy of the SCGA Fore Her newsletter.*
