Words of advice to a newbie:

"Enjoy where you are – look around, hear the birds, see the trees, and chase a little ball. It's very soothing to the mind *(really Brenda?)* and you will meet wonderful people." *(absolutely!)* Life lesson from golf:

"Patience and forever optimism, as you just never know, this COULD be the shot!" **Question:** Can you rake the sand before you hit your ball out of the bunker?

Answer: Yes and No! Yes, if you are smoothing the sand to care for the course. Rule 12.

No, if you are testing the condition of the sand to learn information for the next stroke or improve the Condition Affecting the Stroke (CATS). Rule 8.1.

How can you tell if someone is smoothing the sand to care for the course? You ask! Generally speaking, don't rake your line of play or the area around your ball or stance. You will incur a general penalty.

Questions: In match-play, your opponent asks you the following questions. Is she in breach of Rule 10.2 (Advice and Other Help)?

- 1. How far is it to the water hazard?
- 2. Which club did you use?

3. Is it a 2-club wind? Answers:

1. No. Distance is info, not advice.

2. Yes, she cannot ask you which club you hit. She incurs a general penalty. (*no additional penalty for fibbing!*)

3.Yes, wind strength is advice. She incurs a general penalty.
