Rules Corner



Question: What are two rules that are often followed incorrectly?

Answer #1:

Most people think picking up the ball carefully to identify it and placing it right back, is the correct way to identify a ball. NOPE! You must *mark the ball first*, then lift it to identify it. You must also mark it if you are simply rolling it back and forth a little to identify it.

(Rule 14.1a)

Answer #2:

Dropping the ball from knee height. Knee height means knee height when standing straight. You can bend as low as you like, but you need to drop your ball from the height of your knees when standing straight. (Rule 14.3b)

Question: Do you get relief from a mound caused by an animal? (Rule 16.1)

Answer:

Yes. The definition of Animal Hole includes the loose material dug out of the hole, as well as any area of the ground pushed up or altered as a result of the animal digging the hole. Note, there is *no free relief* if the ball is in a Penalty Area.
