Rules Corner



Question: What happens if you whiff or dribble your tee shot?

Answer: It depends where your ball ends up. Either way, it counts as 1 stroke. If you whiff, the ball is still sitting on the tee and you can hit again which would be your 2nd shot. If you dribble the ball off the tee, then it depends on whether the ball is still in the teeing area. The teeing area is from the front edge of the tee markers to two club lengths behind the tee markers.

If the ball is in the teeing area, you may play the ball as it lies or you may move the ball to any other spot within the teeing area and play from there without penalty. You may also place the ball on a tee or adjust the height of the tee.(Rule 6.2b(6))

If the ball goes beyond teeing area, and you wish to retee, you will be using stroke and distance rule, and incur a 1-stroke penalty. Or you can hit from where the ball lies without penalty – you will be hitting your second shot.

If you hit your ball off the tee during a practice swing by accident, you can retee without penalty and you will be hitting your first shot.
