### Rules Corner



Do you ever wonder how to determine where your ball lies if it is between two areas of the course? Check out rule 2.2c, copied below. **Summary:** There are 5 areas of the course: **General area** and 4 **Specific areas:** Teeing area, Penalty area, Bunkers and Putting green.

If part of the ball is in both the *general area* and one of the four *specific areas of the course*, it is treated as lying in that *specific area of the course*.

If part of the ball is in two specific areas of the course, it is treated as lying in the specific area that comes first in this order: *penalty area, bunker, putting green*.

**Some examples:** If any part of the ball is in between penalty demarcation and the general area, it is considered to be in the penalty area.

If any part of the ball is on the green and the general area, then the ball is on the green.

If any part of the ball is in the general area, even if part of the ball is on the out of bounds marker, it is considered in bound in the general area because out-of-bounds is not one of the areas.
