Rules Corner



Can Itap down a divot or some grass near my ball...move sand near my ball...rake footprints left in a bunker...break a branch that is in my backswing?

The Rules of Golf have 2 great principles: play the ball as it lies and the course as it is found. A player may not press down a divot or grass near the ball if that would improve the lie or the player's stance, swing or, line of play. If there is sand near the ball, it may only be removed from the putting green or teeing area. Footprints in a bunker can be raked but NOT to improve the player's lie, stance, area of intended swing, or line of play. If you have a branch in your backswing, you cannot break it off to improve the area of your backswing. However, if you break a branch during your stroke and you complete the stroke, there is no penalty. The penalty for improving your lie is typically the General Penalty: **two penalty strokes in stroke play or loss of hole in match play**, under Rule 8.1
