Rules Corner



Question: How many clubs can you have in your bag?

Answer: 14 clubs maximum. You can have training aids such as alignment sticks, as long as you do not use them during the round. If someone accidentally puts her club in your bag and you were not aware, there is no penalty, but you must not use it and must remove it from your bag. (Rule 4.1b, Rule 4.3)

Question: Can you replace a damaged club/s during a round?

Answer: Yes, IF it wasn't a case of abuse, such as if you were SOOO mad you missed a shot and smacked the club on a tree trunk (Rule 4.1a).

Question: What is the penalty if you discover during your round that you are carrying more than 14 clubs?

Answer: In stroke play you will incur general penalty (2 strokes) per hole you were in violation, up to 4 strokes max. In match play, you will deduct 1 hole up to 2 holes max. For example, if you realized you had more than 14 clubs on hole 5, and you were up 3, you will deduct 2 holes and be up 1. (Rule 4.1b).
