Rules Corner



Question: What happens when two balls collide mid-air?

Answer:

If two balls played from anywhere other than on the green collide in mid-air: Play both balls from where they came to rest. No penalty.

When both balls in motion were played from the green and they collide: both players replace their ball on their original spot. No penalty.

When one ball is played from off the green and the other ball is played from the putting green and they collide: the ball from off the green is played from where it comes to rest. The ball played from the green must be replaced on its original spot. No penalty. (Rule 11.1)

Next month we will look at a slightly different scenario – when a ball in motion hits and moves a ball at rest.
